



WANT TO SIGN-UP FOR HEALTH INSURANCE?

SIGN UP TODAY! There are enrollment counselors in your community who can help you apply for one New York's health insurance programs. They will help you fill out the application, gather documents, and choose a health plan if needed. All information is kept confidential!

TO SIGN-UP: Families will need to complete an application and show proof of identity, age, address and family income. Don't worry if you don't have everything on this list—you will get help on what you can use! Photocopies of the documents are ok. Adults may need to provide some additional documents.

DATE OF BIRTH/IDENTITY

1

- Driver's License, or
- Birth Certificate, or
- Passport, or
- Baptismal or other religious certificate, or
- School Records

HOME ADDRESS

2

- Lease, or letter from land lord, or
- Gas, Electric or Telephone bill (must be within 6 months), or
- Postmarked envelope sent to you

FAMILY INCOME*

3

- Paycheck stubs (current) for one month's income, or
- Letter from your job, or
- Signed income tax form

*(*You do not have to have an income or job to qualify.)*

DO YOU OR SOMEONE IN YOUR FAMILY NEED HEALTH INSURANCE?

New York State offers low-cost and free health insurance for children, teens and adults through the Child Health Plus, Medicaid and Family Health Plus Programs. Even people who work and immigrants can join!

THESE PROGRAMS PROVIDE IMPORTANT MEDICAL SERVICES LIKE:

- Regular check-ups • hospital care • prescription drugs • dental care
- eyeglasses • vaccinations • mental health services • emergency room
- medical equipment • and much more!

TO SIGN-UP FOR HEALTH INSURANCE:

Families will need to complete an application and show proof of identify, age, where you live and family income. But don't worry, there are enrollment counselors right in your neighborhood that can help you fill out the application and gather all the documents you need.
