

Kimberley Chin joined the staff at the Children's Defense Fund-New York as the Deputy Director in September 2016. Ms. Chin was most recently the Director of Public/Private Partnerships at the NYC Administration for Children's Services (ACS) where she managed the Office of Public/Private Partnerships to strengthen ACS' partnerships and leverage funding to serve New York City's children, families and communities. Before joining ACS, Ms. Chin was an Atlantic Philanthropies Senior Visiting Fellow at Fordham Law School's Feerick Center for Social Justice focused on economic justice and equity issues. While at Atlantic Philanthropies, Ms. Chin served as the Programme Executive focused on children's health where she was committed to ensuring that children gained access to health insurance coverage through Medicaid, SCHIP and the health care reform law. She engaged in national and state-level philanthropy, creating a network of partners, the KidsWell initiative, engaged in advocating for and enrolling children in health insurance coverage. Prior to joining the Atlantic Philanthropies, Ms. Chin was the founding director of Maryland Hunger Solutions, an initiative of the Food Research and Action Center (FRAC). Maryland Hunger Solutions uses research, policy analysis, outreach, coalition-building and information dissemination to raise awareness and change policy and practice to connect struggling families to federal nutrition programs. Before founding Maryland Hunger Solutions, Ms. Chin held several positions at the Children's Defense Fund (CDF), both nationally and in the New York office - including coordinating immigration, children's health and tax benefits projects. Previously, Ms. Chin worked at the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities in Washington D.C. on issues related to children's health insurance access and income supports for families and was an attorney in the HIV/AIDS unit at South Brooklyn Legal Services in New York City. Ms. Chin received her MPA from New York University and her law degree from Fordham University in New York City. Ms. Chin is married and is the proud mother of three young sons.
