Since 1973, the Children's Defense Fund has convened and participated in many coalitions and worked with numerous organizations, policymakers and community networks to help build bipartisan support in enacting laws and policies that have helped millions of children escape poverty and receive needed health care, nutrition, Head Start and Early Head Start, child care, education, special education, family support services, adoption assistance, protections for children in the child welfare and juvenile justice systems, and protection from gun violence. Children do not come in pieces and need a comprehensive qualitybased continuum of care from birth to adulthood. Through careful research, public education, policy development, implementation and monitoring, and grassroots organizing we have tried to help build a national house, where every child is healthy, safe and educated, room by room.
