# NEW YORK POLICE DEPARTMENT STUDENT SAFETY ACT DATA: JULY 1, 2017 TO JUNE 30, 2018



During the 2017-2018 school year there were 11,009 incidents in schools reported by the NYPD through the Student Safety Act, a local law established to bring transparency to the scope of police contact with students in NYC schools. Reported incidents are categorized as "interventions" and refer to arrests, summonses, child in crisis incidents, juvenile reports, PINS / warrants, and mitigated incidents. The NYPD offers the following definitions for interventions outside of an arrest or criminal court summons:

- Child in Crisis a student who is displaying signs of emotional distress who is removed to the hospital for psychological evaluations.
- Juvenile Report a report taken for a person under 16 in lieu of an arrest or summons where the student is normally detained by the NYPD for the time it takes to complete the report.
- *PINS / Warrant* a person in need of supervision family court warrant.
- *Mitigated* the student is released to the school rather than being processed for an arrest or summons.

There are many pieces of the Student Safety Act data that make drawing more detailed conclusions difficult. For example, the NYPD reported that in 97% of "mitigated" incidents, the DOE was the "enforcement" agency – raising questions about how mitigation processes are initiated and who is involved. That same question holds for "child in crisis" incidents, where the NYPD reported the "enforcement" agency as "N/A" in 91% of all incidents.


It is important to note that school-based arrests, summonses, juvenile reports, and PINS / warrants are largely carried out by patrol officers – outside of the division of School Safety – rather than by School Safety Agents who are in schools full-time or the School Safety Division's Uniformed Task Force:

Further, 78% of all arrests in schools were conducted by Patrol Officers and the NYPD's Detective Bureau. Much of the enforcement activity by School Safety Agents (SSAs) appears to be focused on juvenile reports, representing 49.3% of all SSA interventions and 46.7% of all reported school-based juvenile reports:

Students of color were more likely to have contacts with the NYPD in school than white students: Latinx students were 2.4 times more likely and Black students were 5.8 times more likely to experience a reported police intervention in schools than white students.
